

# A NEW RACE OF DICRURUS FROM THE ISLAND MOROTAI (N. MOLUCCAS)

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In preparing a Handlist of the birds of the Moluccan islands, I found among the material in the Rijksmuseum van Natuurlijke Historie, Leiden, a race of *Dicrurus* that needs description:

## *Dicrurus bracteatus morotaiensis* nov. subspec.

Diagnosis:

Distinguished from *atrocaeruleus* Gray (1860) — Batjan and Halmahera — by smaller culmen and wing. Habitat: Island Morotai (N. Moluccas).

Type: ♂, leg. Bernstein, 2-I-1862, Mira, Island Morotai, in the collection Rijksmuseum van Natuurlijke Historie, Leiden.

The new race is placed in the species *bracteatus*, but I can see few reasons for splitting the "superspecies" *hottentottus* in different "species" like *hottentottus*, *leucops* and *bracteatus*. There are other 'groups in this super-species that could claim specific rank on the same doubtful reasons.

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
