G i l l i l a n d, H. B. (1911-1965)

Educated in Edinburgh, he worked after 1934 in South Africa on taxonomy and ecology, during his war service made ecological studies in Somaliland, on which he was awarded a D.Sc. degree in 1947, and afterwards educated many in the field of applied ecology. Came to Singapore in Sept. 1955 to succeed Dr. Holttum in the Chair of Botany at the University of Malaya; his department under his hands grew considerably and a second department was established by him at Kuala Lumpur University. In 1960-1964 he was Dean of Science, and sometimes Acting Vice-Chancellor, ably handling difficulties. He

finished the MS of his 'Grasses of Malaya', to be published as volume 3 of the revised Flora of Malaya. He was also keenly interested in conservation and served as a trustee on the Singapore Nature Reserves Board for nearly 6 years. For his health he had to go to a drier climate and returned early in 1965 to South Africa, but died there of pneumonia. He is remembered as a great gentleman and an enthusiastic botanist. P r i t z e l, G. A. (1815-1874)

The greatest 19th century bibliographer of botany, whose 'Thesaurus literaturae botanicae' (1852, new ed. 1872) is still regularly consulted because of its accuracy and completeness. Pritzel worked in Berlin from 1843, started making a monograph of Anemone, subsequently also prepared an 'Iconum botanicarum index' (1855-1865) which became the foundation of the Index Londinensis; he died in a mental hospital practically unnoticed.
